#### **End of Year Results Evaluation**

#### Year 1

Gaps closed in Reading, Writing and Maths as higher percentage of pupil premium children made expected or better progress than non-PP children.

# <u>Year 2</u>

Gap to national closed in Maths and were sustained in reading and writing. Difference between children in main classroom setting and AP classroom setting show that gaps were closed for reading and writing.

### Year 3

Gaps closed in Reading, Writing and Maths as higher percentage of pupil premium children made expected or better progress than non-PP children. PP children have now performing higher than Non-PP children in school for reading.

## Year 4

Gaps closed in Maths and were sustained In reading and writing maths.

## <u>Year 5</u>

Gaps were sustained in writing and maths- mobility into this year group has had an effect on end of year figures.
