Year 6 End-of-Year Drayton Manor Trip

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to share that, as a special end-of-Year 6 celebration, we are planning a visit to **Drayton Manor Theme Park on Friday 26th June 2026**. This trip is a wonderful opportunity for our pupils to celebrate their time at Mowmacre together and to create memories filled with fun, friendship, and enjoyment as they reach the end of their primary journey. To make this experience as accessible as possible, the cost of the trip has been substantially subsidised by the school, and therefore the **price for each child will be £20**. We kindly ask that **payment is made in full, as this will enable the trip to go ahead as planned**.

Please note that this is not an academic visit, but rather a well-deserved celebration of the pupils' achievements, resilience, and contributions during their time at Mowmacre.

Behaviour Expectations

Because this trip involves rides, large crowds, and an exciting environment, excellent behaviour is essential—both on the day and in the weeks leading up to the trip. This is not only to showcase the outstanding behaviour we expect from Mowmacre pupils, but also to ensure safety at all times. Children will be exploring the park in small, supervised groups, ensuring they are safe while still having the freedom to enjoy the attractions with their peers.

As part of our behaviour management approach, we sometimes use a report card. When a child goes on report they are given personalized behaviour targets, the class teacher initials whether or not targets have been met for each lesson. Parents are contacted before a child goes on report to explain why a report card is needed and how it will be helpful for the child. If a child goes on report twice during the Summer term, they will not be permitted to attend this trip. This is because going on report twice shows that we have not seen enough consistent improvement in behaviour to make the trip safe for that child. Please be assured that parents are contacted before a child goes on report, so parents will be kept aware of their child's behaviour.

We want every child to attend, and we will support them in making positive behaviour choices. We truly hope no one misses out.

We are extremely excited about this opportunity, and we are sure the children will be too. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation—we look forward to giving our Year 6 pupils a memorable and joyful end-of-year celebration.
